

**WALLA WALLA CITY COUNCIL**  
**Work Session Minutes**  
**February 12, 2018**

**1. CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Clark called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

**2. ACTIVE AGENDA**

A. First Amendment Assemblies.

Police Chief Bieber outlined the police department's policies and protocols in dealing with First Amendment Assemblies.

There was discussion on the lessons learned from the "Where's Kathy" rally held last year and enforcement of disorderly conduct and noise ordinance violations; and the specific event process. The special event process is content neutral.

B. Options for improvement of the Third Avenue and Tietan Street intersection.

City Engineer Chavre reported there is an infrastructure repair and replacement project scheduled in 2019 which will provide an opportunity to improve the intersection of Tietan Street and Third Avenue. A consultant was hired and prepared an alternatives analysis that has been reviewed. The consultant and staff are recommending a "mini roundabout" at this intersection rather than a traffic signal or four-way stop.

- Concept of installing a pedestrian overpass to address pedestrian safety at this intersection.
- Provision for bicyclists.
- Process for selecting projects is based on a prioritization matrix and funding.
- On-street parking and driveway access in the immediate area of the intersection.

C. Video recording/streaming of City Council meetings.

Councilmember Clubb reported he had met with staff to discuss the feasibility of video recording and streaming City Council meetings. Staff reviewed some of the technology and archiving issues that will need to be addressed and asked Council to provide direction on whether having City Council meetings video recorded is something they are interested in pursuing. There was discussion on the potential advantages and disadvantages.

A majority of Councilmembers indicated they would like staff to develop a proposal for consideration.
